TRANSFER OF CREDIT

2017 and 2018 GLBBS GRADUATES

All graduates of the 2017-2018 Traditional Boat Building & Classic Woodworking Program, consisting of (9 months), (1132 clock hours), exceeds the clock hour requirement for the accredited 2018-2019 Comprehensive Career Boat Building Program Module I course's totaling (356.25 clock hours) and (6 clock hours) of Module II course, Finishing. Therefore, 2017 and 2018 graduates have met the prerequisite course requirements and course clock hours of Module I and partial clock hours of Module II totaling credits totaling (362.25) for the above three courses and are exempt from taking the required first CCBB Module I courses of Traditional Boat Building and Composite I, and partial credit for Module II, course Finishing.

Enrollment for all 2017 and 2018 graduates starts on September 17, 2018 for the Comprehensive Career Boat Building Program, consists of the second, third, and fourth module course content and concludes on Friday, June 14, 2019.

Tuition is grandfathered as disclosed in the 2017-2018 catalog, Board of Directors approved dated July 2017, for \$13,500, including shop/material fee.
